I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim R. 5839 it appears that Robert Horton (who served as Whorton) while a resident of Culpeper County, Virginia enlisted February 9, 1776, served as drummer in Captain John Thornton's Company, Third Virginia Regiment, was in the battles of White Plains, York Island, Brandywine and Germantown and was discharged in February 1778 at Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 10, 1818 while a resident of Culpeper County, Virginia aged sixty-six years. He died April 13, 1820.

Soldier married in Culpeper County, Virginia in the fall of 1778, Jaley, maiden name not stated. In 1837 she was living in Falls Township, Muskingum County, Ohio aged eighty-three years. Their daughter Mary, who married a Mr. Anderson was living in 1837.
